The loss of Piping & Drumming Tutors combined with the loss of a number of senior pipers and drummers

has also certainly impacted on the band but it is heartening to see last years recruits take up the slack as our new senior players.

We will be recruiting again in January for new members to join as Display Corps/ Tenor Drummers.

Thanks to Ronan Madden, our piping tutor, we will also (for the first time) recruit additional pipers in January in an attempt to increase the overall musical strength of the



pipe band.

We will not recruit any additional snare drummers at this time as current numbers are more than adequate for our piping strength.

New Snare Drums and Carriers

The band has recently acquired four new red Andante Mini/Junior Reactor snare drums. These are a lightweight 7" version of the Reactor drum. Special alloys are used for strength but also reduce weight and increase comfort.

We have also obtained four TG Small/Junior Snare Drum Carriers scaled down to fit the younger and more smaller player.

Unfortunately, we do not, at this time, have the funds to pay the supplier for either of these items. He has generously agreed to wait for payment.

We will need to purchase more of these drum carriers on a priority basis for our tenor drummers but will have to clear the current debt before proceeding with these.

To celebrate the end of its Autumn/Winter season the band's Annual Christmas Bowling night out has been organized by Ann O'Driscoll for Monday 20th December.


As in previous years this event, which is free to members, will be held at Supermacs on the Ennis Road during normal band practice times.

CBS Pipe Band was founded during the winter months of 1961 by Irish Christian Brothers, Br. John Kenny and Br Clement Wright.

There followed an intensive programme over the next eighteen months to equip and train the band.

The band made its first ever public appearance in the Limerick St. Patrick's Day parade of 1963 and since then has missed only three St. Patrick's Day parades in its native city. On two occasions the band represented the city in the New York parade and once in the city of Cork parade.

The band has performed extensively throughout all thirty two counties of Ireland and beyond, having travelled on numerous occasions to Scotland, England, Wales, France, Germany, Holland, Belgium, Spain, Italy and the United States of America.

Membership Fees

The second installment of membership fees is due immediately after the Christmas holidays.

This is also a gentle reminder to a small number of members who still owe the first installment of membership fees from last October.

Our band rules state that:

"Annual membership fees are payable in two installments (First week in October and 1st week in January). A 50% waiver of fees will apply to a second or subsequent member from the same family."

We have always tried to keep these fees as low as possible on the understanding that through their participation in fundraising events our members

will recompense the band.

However, the recent reduction in our membership combined with a reduction in the average age of members makes it all the more essential that we receive prompt payment.

While the band really needs the funds, we do not wish to lose membership through a genuine inability to pay.

At the same time, in fairness to those members who have paid their fees, we must follow-up on late payments from other members.
