On 4th November 2008, the President of Latvia Mr. Valdis Zatlers visited Limerick as part of a three day visit to Ireland to coincide with the 90th anniversary celebrations of Latvian independence.

The first stop on his visit was at Presentation Secondary School where the red carpet was rolled out. Students from Presentation Secondary and Primary Schools were joined in forming a guard of honour by students from Coláiste Mhichíl Secondary School, Scoil Íosagáin Primary School and St. Michael's Infant School.



Mr Zatlers, who was accompanied by First Lady Lilita Zatlere, ambassadors and embassy officials, was then treated to a musical extravaganza in the school hall.

Pipe Corporal Colin Byrnes of the CBS Pipe Band was among the traditional musicians who performed for the president, playing a reel on the bagpipes. And the Presentation Schooll Choir had even learned the words of the Latvian national anthem for the occasion.

Italy Trip 2009

Arising from the cancellation by Ryanair of their scheduled flights from Shannon to Berlin we have been forced to change our travel plans for this year's trip.

Following discussions with participants and parents it was agreed that we are now travelling to Italy instead of Germany.

We will be flying from Shannon to Bergamo (Milan) on Thursday 1st October and returning from Treviso (Venice) on Monday 5th October.

The tour will include visits to

- Milan (including San Siro Stadium)
- Lake Garda (including boat trip on lake)
- Parco Naturo Viva (safari park)
- Gardaland Theme Park
- Verona (including Juliette's house)
- Venice (including waterbus)

The first and second deposits for the trip have been paid to the tour company and the final payment of outstanding monies will be due immediately prior to the band's summer holiday shut down at the end of June.

The band has already subsidised the 8.8% of the overall cost of the trip based on Band Travel Credits awarded in September 2008 and January 2009. The next subsidy will occur in early April based on BTCs earned for the period January to March 2009. We also would encourage those travelling to continue to avail of the band's ongoing travel savings fund (Confirmation money etc. will help!) in order to alleviate the expenses involved.

The band was founded during the winter months of 1961 by Christian Brothers Br. John Kenny and Br. C Wright.

There followed an intensive programme over the next eighteen months to equip and train the band.

The band made its first ever public appearance in the Limerick St. Patrick's Day parade of 1963 and since then has only missed three St. Patrick's Day parades in its native city. On two occasions the band represented the city in the New York parade and once in the city of Cork parade.

The band has performed extensively throughout the thirty two counties of Ireland and beyond, having traveled on numerous occasions to Scotland, England, Wales, France, Germany, Holland, Belgium, Spain and the United States of America.

National Youth Pipe Band Concert

On Saturday 21st February, fifteen members of our band participated in the of the National Youth Piping and Drumming Ensemble's "Celtic Notes" concert which was held in Siamsa Tire, Tralee, County Kerry.

Following a full day of rehearsals, the concert commenced at 7.30pm, ran for two hours and was attended by many dignitaries including mayor of Tralee Cllr. Ted Fitzgerald.

More than 120 musicians from seventeen bands from all over the country participated on stage and, together with the Kingdom Dancers, Rinceoirí na Ríochta, performed a combination of contemporary and traditional music, song and dance which combined modern electronic instruments with traditional bagpipes and drums.
